Here are some things you can do to make sure your child's first dental visit is a good one:

Most American children don't visit the dentist until they are over two years old, which is later than is recommended by dental and medical professionals.

The American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) recommends that a child go to the dentist by age one or within six months after the first tooth erupts. Primary teeth typically begin growing in around six months of age.
